Erin's work focuses upon intersections of gentrification, technology, digitality, empire, and racial capitalism in the US and in Romania, alongside housing justice organizing, countermapping, and transnational solidarities. Erin is the author of *Silicon Valley Imperialism: Techno Fantasies and Frictions in Postsocialist Times* (Duke University Press, 2024), and is cofounder of the Anti-Eviction Mapping Project—a data visualization, counter-cartography, and digital media collective dedicated to the work of organizing for housing justice.
